



SG 2 SDM Training

- Visits to Denmark completed: the German UKSH-team successfully visited the Danish implementation modules Teach The Teacher (TTT) and Teach The Leader (TTL). They will now look at how they can transfer the concepts to Germany and develop their own approaches accordingly.
- MAPPIN'SDM rater training: Antje of the CFFB-team are currently taking part in MAPPIN'SDM's German rater training programme. They are learning how to use the measurement tool to assess video recordings of doctor-patient consultations with regard to the existing SDM level.
- Co-operation between SHS and Kiel: as feedback is used as a training method in both clinics, both partners will exchange experiences and potentially develop a joint concept

SG₃ **Decision Aids**

- German Decision Aids in Denmark: NFS' paediatric department is interested in trying out German PtDAs in Denmark. To this end they will review decision aids clustered around Juvenile Rheumatoid Arthritis and Appendicitis. A first adapted version might feature Danish texts and subtitles videos.
- 🦫 Beslutningshjælper Translation: A WHO-compliant German translation of the Beslutningshjælper template has been created, comprised of a twin translation, blinded twin back-translation and successive consensus-finding.
- 🦫 Encounter Tools in Germany: Based on the translated template, at least three paper-based encounter tools will be developed and tested in German hospitals. At this point they will probably be on the following topics: early-stage prostate cancer, epilepsy, and artificial insemination.
